Daffodil: The national flower of Wales, daffodils were brought to Britain by the Romans.

Heather: An important food source for deer, mountain hares and sheep. It can also be used to make honey, tea, and wine!



Daisy: Their names comes from the old English for 'days end', as daisies close their petals at night and reopen them in the morning.

Dandelions: Often seen as just a weed, dandelions have many uses, and can be made into tea, dyes, and food!



Thistle: The oldest recorded national flower, this Scottish symbol has prickly leaves protecting it from being eaten by wildlife.
